ACUP RALLIES SUPPORT FOR WILFRID LAURIER UNIVERSITY PRESS

TORONTO – December 11, 2014 – The Association of Canadian University Presses (ACUP) has joined forces with other members of the Publishing community to rally support for Wilfrid Laurier University **Press (WLUP**). WLUP has recently been informed through a university -wide institution process that the Press "is not essential to the vision and mission of the University" and that the subsidy the Press received should be phased-out as an operational program.

The "Phase Out or Minimize" recommendation made by the University report will have an extremely damaging effect on WLUP, its authors and the broader scholarly community.

WLUP has been a leader in the dissemination of scholarly research for 40 years. Over the past decade alone, it has been regularly nominated and repeatedly won such prestigious awards as the Governor General's Literary Award in Non-Fiction, the Gabrielle Roy Prize, the Canada Book Prize in the Social Sciences and the Canada Book Prize in the Humanities (both of which are awarded by the Canadian Federation for the Humanities and Social Sciences).

WLUP has published widely acclaimed Canadian authors including, Bruce Elder, Janice Stein, Nikki Strong-Boag and Smaro Kamboureli, as well as such leading Wilfred Laurier faculty members as Cynthia Comacchio, Michel Desjardins, and Eleanor Ty.

WLUP established its reputation for excellence in scholarly publishing in the areas of Canadian Literature, Indigenous Studies, Life Writing, Environmental Humanities, Childhood and Family Studies, Film and Media Studies, Cultural Studies, Religious Studies, and social work.
